Infiltration Best Management Practices have become the preferred method of meeting the EPA's NPDES Phase II storm water regulations. It is vital, however, that designers have a working knowledge of soils, design principles, and proper plant selection.

The morning portion of this seminar will cover all facets of site evaluation and design including initial BMP selection, soils and engineered soil mixes, and operations and maintenance concerns. The afternoon portion will feature a site planning design charrette, followed by an outdoor session featuring a tour of a highly successful onsite rain garden, a review of plant selection, and soil and infiltration demonstrations.

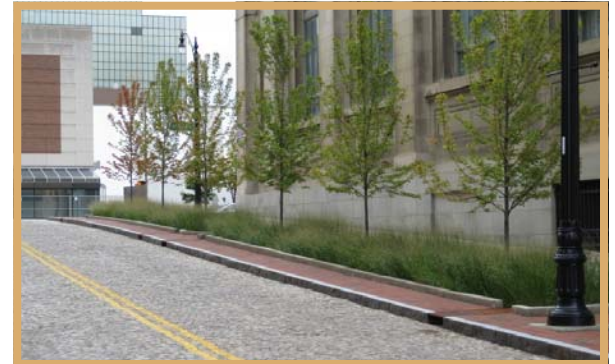
